- 4. THINK the best of your pastor. If you ever question his or her integrity, go to them directly. If you ever hear gossip about your pastor, don't spread it, go to your pastor and uncover the works of the enemy.
- 5. SERVE your pastor. A servant's heart doesn't just pick and choose what they want to do. They do what is needed and what is requested.
- 6. ADAPT your ministry to the church vision so the church can work together in unity of purpose.

- 7. ATTEND church services and functions. Be faithful to serve on a team and in outreaches. Your presence means more than you know.
- 8. OBEY the Scriptures and return God's tithe (ten percent of your increase) to the local church. Those funds belong to God and help your church to operate and pay expenses. When possible, give towards church projects to help the vision come to pass.
- 9. GET ALONG with other people in the church. Do your best to live in peace with one another.
- 10. RESPECT the pastor's personal time with God and time with his or her family.
